

DEAR FRIENDS

FY 2013 was a productive and rewarding year for Oak-Leyden during which we made considerable progress toward reaching goals established in our strategic plan. While one of our long-standing and respected Board members, Cathy Dahl, retired we continue to value the diversity and the broad range of expertise reflected in our Board, knowing that it will provide direction to our efforts, priorities to our plans and astuteness to our fundraising energies. We are confident of success, propelling us forward with both established approaches and innovative programs. With your assistance we continue to provide the crucial services described in the pages of this Annual Report.

We hope that as you leaf through the report's pages, you will note that the appearance of our main building has been significantly improved and that now our façade reflects the quality and value of the services we provide within.

Our residential program has been expanding to meet the high demand for quality home environments for adults to live with dignity and inclusion in their communities. As we look to the future, we will increase the number of our comfortable family-style homes and will replace some with new construction, specifically designed to accommodate the needs of adults with development disabilities while blending in with the surrounding neighborhood.

Our day services for adults are also undergoing transformative changes. In June, 2013 we faced a great challenge, discovering that the roof trusses at our Developmental Training (DT) Program in Oak Park were failing and that we needed to vacate the building until this problem had been addressed. Fortunately, we were able to provide our program, on which so many depend, at the Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church. Pastor Lietz kindly opened the doors to our program participants until the roof could be repaired. The failed trusses presented the opportunity to re-configure the floor plan of the building to better serve the people who attend this program site daily. The newly remodeled space will allow our staff to provide the services described in this report in a fresh, updated environment.

As we improve and expand our services for adults, so do we also for children from birth to 5 years of age. This past year we initiated a program for children 3 to 5 who did not qualify for their school district's Early Childhood classroom. The parent-child program for children who still exhibit mild developmental delays, enables the facilitator to provide parents with ideas and resources to help promote the continued development of their child's skills. Additionally we received the exciting news that the Children's Program was selected as the beneficiary of the 2013, 700 Bonnie Brae in River Forest, IL Annual Charity 911 LemonAid Stand, which will enable us to construct an outdoor therapeutic play space, offering another way for us to serve Oak-Leyden's little ones.

All in all we have been busy during FY 2013, but could have not achieved any of our progress without your invaluable assistance. We are grateful for your participation in our many endeavors – your support of our Annual Benefit, your attendance at our bake sales and Candlelight Bowl, your camaraderie at our Fuego Loco Restaurant Day, and your responsiveness to our appeals. We are proud of our community and are appreciative of the trust you place in Oak-Leyden. We pledge to honor your confidence as we continue to assist children from infancy through 5 years of age with developmental delays and to empower adults with developmental disabilities to lead rich and fulfilling lives.



The Oak-Leyden Developmental Training Program provides purposeful and meaningful activities designed to assist adults with developmental disabilities in strengthening their ability to live as independently as possible in their homes and communities. The Developmental Training Program encourages choice by offering a wide variety of classes, clubs, outings and volunteer activities from which participants choose and plan each day. When contract work opportunities arise, participants are also offered the opportunity to earn money while building vocational skills.



NANCY

Nancy has been a part of Oak-Leyden since 2003. She first attended the Developmental Training Program in Franklin Park. Later, she moved to the Oak Park Developmental Training Program. Nancy has always been an active member at Oak-Leyden and in her community. She is a member of First United Pilgrim Church and has participated in the 5K Crop walk at Oak-Leyden. This award is given to participants in an Oak-Leyden Program that go above and beyond expectations.


The Supported Employment Program assists adults with developmental disabilities secure private sector jobs at competitive wages. The program's strength hinges on successfully supporting individuals to retain long term employment. Clients are able to fully participate in the community as tax-paying citizens. In case after case, we find that being employed enhances self esteem and allows for greater choices in the lives of the individuals we serve.

Initiated in 1986, the Supported Employment Program ensures that people with developmental disabilities are individually supported to obtain and hold jobs in the community. Job developers work with our local employers to identify positions that fit well with an individual participant's interests and vocational talents. Job coaches provide on-the-job training to ensure a successful transition and ongoing job support to sustain participant's employment.


EMILY

Emily is a participant in the Supported Employment Program and has been employed by Wonderworks Children's Museum since February 2005. In fact, she is their longest tenured employee. Emily is an integral part of the Museum. She keeps the Museum neat and clean for patrons, restocks supplies, interacts with patrons and assists with staff training. Emily has a positive attitude towards her work and loves her job.

Emily's successful employment has been made possible with the help of her vocational coach provided by Oak-Leyden's Supported Employment Program and support from her employer. Emily's employer, Wonderworks Children's Museum was awarded Oak-Leyden's 2012-2013 Employer of the Year Award. It is because of its great support for Emily, for Oak-Leyden and for the community that we recognize this wonderful Museum.



COMMUNITY LIVING SERVICES



Through Oak-Leyden's Community Living Service program, adult participants enjoy comfort and safety in homes located in surrounding communities. Residents are provided 24-hour support and care that promote personal independence and physical well-being.

Our participants live in family style homes that allow for attention to their individual needs. The Community Integrated Living Arrangements (CILAs) provide a path laden with developmental stepping stones to independence for each individual. Participants are able to build a foundation on which they grow and live as independently as possible, participating in communities as their neighbors do.

In addition, Oak-Leyden offers intermittent support to adults with developmental disabilities who live on their own in the community. Oak-Leyden staff help Intermittent CILA participants maintain their personal independence by providing the support they need.



MULTIDISCIPLINARY CLINIC

The Multidisciplinary Clinic is a unique concept initiated by Oak-Leyden twelve years ago. It is a strong example of the organization's attentive response to one of the largest service gaps existing for people with developmental disabilities.

The Multidisciplinary Clinic is a treatment strategy that links each clinician coordinating a participant's particular health care need to other providers caring for that individual. This forms a chain of communication that ensures accurate and appropriate attention to each participant's health and wellness needs.

The health and well-being of our participants is a necessary and integral factor to each individual's success. The Multidisciplinary Clinic helps provide this support. Oak-Leyden is firm in its commitment to achieving our mission – *to help children and adults with developmental disabilities meet life's challenges and reach their highest potential.*



3 1/2 year old Elliott Park aged out of our Early Intervention (EI) in May, went on to public school, and now is looking forward to returning to Oak-Leyden. His mom and dad plan to switch Elliott's morning school sessions to the afternoon just so that he can be part of Oak-Leyden's Friday morning Music Together class once again.

The Parks first learned that Elliott might have Down Syndrome through an ultrasound. After his birth confirmed the diagnosis, Elliott's parents began to educate themselves about Down Syndrome (the condition), and the developmental delays that would accompany it, as well as the effectiveness of Early Intervention programs. Originally enrolled in EI near their home, when it was time to begin developmental therapy, they turned to Oak-Leyden whose developmental therapist Brandi Carson, is also a music therapist.

Brandi is amazing, say the Parks. Elliott had been very quiet, very hesitant, but Brandi found his personality. Once the two got to know one another, Elliott's personality began to emerge. He was very attentive to her, and to the music and the movements that accompany the music. Those movements led to signing, it is because of Brandi and music therapy that Elliott loves dancing and playing instruments. Elliott also became very, very adaptable and especially great with transitions, for which the Parks credit Brandi.

She helped shape who he is and how he expresses himself. These days he is starting to talk, and assert his independence, happy to jump on the school bus, none of his old hesitations are evident. He wrestles with his older brother, but is gentle with his baby sister. There are more similarities than differences between Elliott and his peers. At the end of the day, says his dad, they are just like any other family.

And like any other family, they look forward to revisiting an old pleasure — Music Together®—available to children with developmental delays as well as to typically developing children in the community




Services and Supports Provided through Early Intervention

- Developmental screenings and evaluations
- Direct developmental, occupational, physical, and speech/language therapy for infants and toddlers, from birth to 5-years-old
- Individual and group opportunities
- Parent education in strategies and activities designed to meet their individual child's needs
- Parent support through social events, and upon request, parent-to-parent linkages
- Family support services and developmental play groups, as well as field trips, family outings, and referrals to outside services
- Music Together® classes are offered to children and their parents which allows them to increase musical awareness through developmentally appropriate and fun activities. Children in surrounding communities can enroll in Music Together® providing an inclusive environment for children with developmental disabilities


2012 Nicholas Award Recipient


